

**MINUTES OF THE REGULAR MEETING OF THE
EITZEN CITY COUNCIL
November 10, 2020**

The regular meeting of the Eitzen City Council was called to order at 7:04 pm by Mayor Jeffrey Adamson. Council members present were Doug Meyer, Mitch Lutichens and Matt Sauer. Emily Burrichter was absent. Also in attendance were City Clerk Steve Schuldt and guest Larry Nierling.

Minutes of the October 13, 2020 regular meeting were read. Councilmember Sauer moved, second by Councilmember Lutichens and the motion passed to approve the minutes.

October financial statements were reviewed. Councilmember Lutichens moved, second by Councilmember Meyer and the motion passed to approve the financial statements.

Council discussed the Coronavirus (COVID-19) pandemic. No action was taken.

Council reviewed the CARES Act Grant budget. \$12,271.83 has been spent with \$5,960.17 remaining. Additional COVID-19 supplies and equipment will be explored.

Mayor Adamson updated council regarding an encounter with a 3 member team of CDC employees. The investigation results have not yet been released.

Council was informed that canvassing of election ballots will take place on November 12.

Council was informed of new COVID-19 restrictions mandated by Governor Walz.

Mayor Adamson informed council that U.S. Flags lining city streets will be retired following Veterans Day.

Council discussed a noise complaint regarding a resident using a backyard sawmill during evenings and weekends. Mayor Adamson will make contact.

Council discussed street light replacement. Council by consensus decided to use existing lights until depleted then begin replacement with LED units.

Council was informed that fabric is being flushed into the city sewer system along Townline Road. A lift station was completely entangled and inoperable due to the material. A letter is to be drafted and sent to residents along Townline Road, instructing them what not to flush.

Council reviewed October claims payable. Councilmember Lutichens moved, second by Councilmember Meyer and the motion passed to pay all claims.

There being no further business, Councilmember Meyer moved, second by Councilmember Sauer and the motion passed to adjourn at 7:30 pm.
