

**MINUTES OF THE REGULAR MEETING OF THE  
EITZEN CITY COUNCIL  
March 9, 2021**

The regular meeting of the Eitzen City Council was called to order at 7:04 pm by Mayor Jeffrey Adamson. Council members present were Mitch Luttchens, Emily Burrichter, Doug Meyer and Mitch Lange. Also in attendance were city clerk Steve Schuldt, Charlene Selbee from the Fillmore County News and Larry Nierling.

Minutes of the February 9, 2021 meeting were reviewed. Councilmember Meyer moved, second by Councilmember Luttchens and the motion passed to approve the minutes.

February financial statements were reviewed. Councilmember Luttchens moved, second by Councilmember Burrichter and the motion passed to approve the financial statements.

Mayor Adamson updated council regarding installation of a solar system at Wiebke Fur Company. The Wiebke Company will have the ability to sell excess energy production back to the city, however, estimates show there will be no excess energy produced. Installation is expected to begin in summer 2021.

Mayor Adamson informed council that attempts to contact someone to inspect and test power line poles have been unsuccessful. The hope is to have information and pricing at the next council meeting.

Mayor Adamson informed council of pricing from Brad's Electric for lighting and electrical upgrades at the community park. Quotes are as follows: Ballpark-\$9,340.00; Security lights-\$1,260.00; Pulling track-\$4,165.00; Concession outlets-\$2,000.00. The Lions Club has indicated that the pulling track lights and concession outlets will be paid from Family Fun Fest revenue. Emily Burrichter moved, second by Doug Meyer and the motion passed to proceed with the electrical improvements.

Mayor Adamson questioned council members if anyone had any contact with residents regarding sidewalk replacement. No comments were available at this time. Council members were encouraged to reach out to the community for comments and bring to a future council meeting.

Mitch Lange questioned if a standby generator was available for the water supply system. Currently there is a generator available to pump water from the reservoir to city residents but nothing that will power the submersible pumps to fill the reservoir. No action was taken.

Mayor Adamson informed council that the Lions Club will host the Family Fun Fest this year with a tractor pull, demo derby and parade.

Council reviewed February claims payable. Councilmember Luttchens moved, second by Councilmember Burrichter and the motion passed to pay all claims.

There being no further business, Councilmember Meyer moved, second by Councilmember Luttchens and the motion passed to adjourn at 7:33 pm.
