

**MINUTES OF THE REGULAR MEETING OF THE
EITZEN CITY COUNCIL
April 13, 2021**

The regular meeting of the Eitzen City Council was called to order at 7:09 pm by Mayor Jeffrey Adamson. Council members present were Mitch Luttcens, Emily Burrichter, Doug Meyer and Mitch Lange. Also in attendance were city clerk Steve Schuldt, Maintenance Supervisor Darryl Meyer, Larry Nierling and Charlene Selbee from the Fillmore County News.

Minutes of the March 9, 2021 meeting were reviewed. Councilmember Burrichter moved, second by Councilmember Luttcens and the motion passed to approve the minutes.

March financial statements were reviewed. Councilmember Meyer moved, second by Councilmember Burrichter and the motion passed to approve the financial statements.

Councilmember Luttcens inquired what the remaining \$ 7,318.82 playground funds are to be used for. Mayor Adamson explained that the committee is considering the addition of swings and to reserve funds for future maintenance.

Councilmember Luttcens inquired if the lighting project for the community center park area will be completed before July 4th. Darryl Meyer explained that work is to begin in May and will be completed prior to July 4th.

Mayor Adamson presented council with a quote from Mi-Tech Services, Inc. to conduct pole integrity testing within the city. The cost will be \$14.92 per pole for an estimated 200 poles. Councilmember Luttcens moved, second by Councilmember Lange and the motion passed to approve the project.

Mayor Adamson informed council that he is waiting for cost estimates to construct a side along Main Street.

Mayor Adamson presented council with estimates to crack fill Maple Street, 1st Street, Bunge Street, Pine Street, Iowa Avenue North and Portland Avenue at a cost of \$2,700.00. Councilmember Luttcens moved, second by Councilmember Burrichter and the motion passed to approve the project.

Council discussed pavement overlay of Iowa Avenue costing \$71,573.75 and Winnebago Avenue costing \$50,458.75. Council members agreed that Winnebago Avenue was in far worse condition than Iowa Avenue and should be a priority. Councilmember Luttcens moved, second by Councilmember Meyer and the motion passed to approve pavement overlay of Winnebago Avenue.

Mayor Adamson informed council of projected 2022 seal coating of Portland Avenue, 1st Street, Maple Street and Pine Street.

Council reviewed March claims payable. Councilmember Meyer moved, second by Councilmember Luttcens and the motion passed to pay all claims.

There being no further business, Councilmember Burrichter moved, second by Councilmember Lange and the motion passed to adjourn at 7:40 pm.
